Trash Talk

Baltimore City trash schedules are changing. As of July 1st, the city will have one trash day per week and one recycling day per week. The City has named this new system One Plus One. Trash and recycling will be collected Tuesday—Friday. Be on the look-out for the new trash schedule.

What does this mean for you?

- 1) You must place your trash bag (s) in a trash can with a tightly fitted lid. Trash bags that are not in trash cans will receive a citation from the City in the amount of \$50.
- 2) To cut down on large amounts of trash, recycle. It's easier than you think.
- 3) Be sure not to miss your trash or recycling day



Recycling

Here are a couple of items you can recycle:

- Newspaper, catalogs, non-metallic wrapping paper, books, and magazine.
- Glass jars
- Metal food and beverage containers
- Clean paper—all colors and types
- Soda bottles
- Envelopes
- Empty prescription bottles
- Empty aerosol cans
- Clean aluminum foil and pie pans
- Clean cardboard (cereal boxes, ice cream box, cracker box, packaging box, etc.)
- Milk jugs and plastic bottles



You can place your recyclables in a clearly marked container (cardboard box or paper bag if you do not have a city recycling bin). Do not place recyclables in a plastic bag! Be sure to rinse all recyclables before placing them in your recycle container. Please contact the Dept of Public Works for more information regarding One Plus One or Recycling at 410.396.4511 .

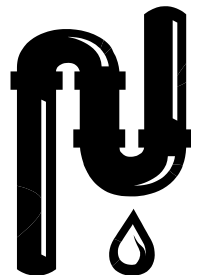


Water Main Project
